

Rail Strikes:



As you will probably be aware, next week London will be dealing with the largest coordinated rail and tube strike in a generation. While this will hopefully not affect too many of our pupils as the majority of them make local journeys to school, this will have a significant impact on staff journeys as many of our staff commute in from considerable distances. At this point I anticipate that all classes will be fully open but with some reorganisation required. It is likely that some

classes may not have their usual class teacher for some days, or for parts of the day, as for some members of staff the journey to work may be significantly delayed or become impossible. In these instances, some teachers may be asked to teach via Google Classroom while another member of staff coordinates activities for the children in the classroom. I would like to emphasise that I anticipate all classes being open and running next week but ask for your additional patience as the strikes will cause significant disruption to staff availability.



Sports Day:

Please arrange for your child/ren to arrive at Finsbury Park athletics track at 9.15am for registration. They will need a packed lunch for this day. If you are attending and staying for lunch, we ask that you hold your child's lunch otherwise all lunches will be collected by a staff member and stored away till lunchtime.

A glorious day is expected for Sports Day 2022. Please ensure your child has enough water and protection from the sun (sun screen, hats). Your child/ren should wear their house colours to represent their teams. (Rouen – red, Domremy – green, Benedict – blue, Fleur de Lys – yellow)

Lunch is at 12pm in the stadium grounds. At this point, parents and caregivers may collect their children but they need to be signed out. No child is to leave without the teacher's knowledge. No child will be allowed to go home independently from the park. Any children not collected will be walked back to school and dismissed at 3pm (unless they are using after school provisions)

We welcome you to stay and enjoy but please remain in the allocated spectator spaces to ensure safety and efficiency of the events.


