# NEW CLASSES FOR SEPTEMBER

Children will have the opportunity to meet their new teacher and teaching assistant on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> July. We are continuing to mix pupils within each class to create two new classes for September 2023. As well as providing us with an opportunity to ensure that each class has an equal number of pupils, it also allows children to expand their social circle within their year group.

Class splits are carried out so that the classes have equal strengths and are equally diverse in all ways. We are very conscious of organising classes so that children have the opportunity to develop further friendships across the year but also maintain links with some of their existing strong friendships. In some cases, we organise the classes so that some children might be separated if their previous learning behaviours had a negative impact on their own or others' learning. In planning the classes, teachers want every child to be happy in their new classroom environment, alongside having a settled and focused learning environment.

Teachers have given this a huge amount of time and attention. We strongly believe the class splits will work well for your child/ren. While some children can sometimes be nervous at first around the new class mixes, it is always the case that come September the children settle quickly and happily into their new classes with new friendships quickly established.
