Books going home:

Children will start to bring home their exercise books ahead of the academic year ending. Looking through the books, they may seem different to previous years. Firstly, due to the lockdown in the spring term there will be less recorded work than in previous years.

Having been encouraged to minimise teacher handling of books at the start of the year, children's books will also have less teacher marking than in previous years. Partly prompted by this requirement, teachers have been using strategic minimal marking this year; this places a greater focus on whole- class feedback and the use of verbal feedback to encourage children to take more ownership of correcting and editing their work.

In maths, particularly across ks2, we have been encouraging children to mark their own work as this enables them to share with the teacher much more rapidly if they are on track within the lesson. This approach has been really positive in the classrooms and both pupils and teachers have shared that the move to more rapidly delivered verbal feedback, and less written marking, has helped greatly in assisting children to move their learning forward. One of the key benefits to this approach has been that teachers have been able to adapt their teaching to mistakes and misconceptions in the children's learning in a much more responsive way.

Next academic year, we will be looking to refine this approach further, following much of the latest educational research which highlights that marking is significantly less important than responsive and systematic feedback to learners. We will update you about our strategy in this area, early in the academic year.

We warmly welcome our new members of staff starting in September.


Mr Newman our new nursery teacher, Ms Burg and Ms Madden who will be supporting the learning in years 5 and 6.

Please read the guidance on footwear and hair styles which is also part of our uniform policy.



We are very fortunate to have an excellent used uniform service which will be available on the playground in September. I have been asked by a number of parents about children returning to school in September in summer uniform. In a climate where we are being rightly so asked to maximise clothing use, this makes perfect sense and is of course permitted.

We will be continuing to allow children to come to school dressed in their PE kits on their PE day in September. We have found this year that this system allowed for maximum time in the lesson to be spent on participation rather than changing. It has also cut down on items left in the lost property.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Covid: England lockdown rules to end on 19 July, PM confirms

Covid restrictions: Changes in England from 19 July



No limit on meeting people but try to meet others outside where possible



People currently working from home should return to the workplace gradually



Nightclubs open and a return to full capacity for theatre and cinema audiences



Businesses and large events encouraged to use Covid-certification to limit the spread of the virus



Face coverings recommended in crowded public spaces, such as public transport



Social distancing no longer mandatory

The Prime Minister has confirmed that the restriction will be lifted but urged everyone to proceed with 'caution' as the pandemic is not 'over'.

Health Secretary Sajid Javid stated that people should meet others outside where possible

It is "expected and recommended" that people should wear face coverings (unless exempt) in crowded public settings such as public transport

Businesses like nightclubs and large events will be encouraged to use Covid-certification in "high risk settings".

A focus will be to encourage people to return to the workplace gradually.

September will see a review to assess how prepared the country is for autumn and winter.



September 2021 gate protocols:

On Aug 31st, you will receive communication from us regarding the implemented egress and ingress system from September onwards. It will prioritise safeguarding and ensuring that when the gates are open, we are doing all we can to ensure our children's safety. It will involve one way systems and year group positions on the playground. There will be a member of staff on each gate whilst the gates are open—as has been the practice this year.

Please familiarise yourself with the new systems being trialled. You achieved a brilliant effort this year with the systems we adopted at the gates. We anticipate the same support next year.
