Anti-Bullying Week 2022

Anti-Bullying Week 2022 is happening from Monday 14th – Friday 18th November and has the theme 'Reach Out'. It is coordinated by the Anti-Bullying Alliance, which is based at a leading children's charity— The National Children's Bureau. They have worked with over 300 children and young people to decide the theme for this year.

Across the week, the children will be learning about the positive things that we can do to halt hurtful behaviour in its tracks. In order to launch this special week, we are asking that all children come to school on Monday 14th November wearing odd socks- these can be as outlandish as they wish them to be.

Children will take part in a whole school assembly for years 1-6 on Monday morning and complete a lesson in class as well as complete activities related to antibullying.

third week in November which aims to raise awareness of bullying of children and young people, in schools and elsewhere, and to highlight ways of preventing and responding to it. It started in 2002 and has since grown to become a significant event in the calendars of children, families and schools with an estimated

Each year we work with 100s of young people to develop a theme for the week that is tailored to specific issues. For example, in 2021 we had the theme 'One Kind Word' and in 2020 'United Against Bullying'. We launch the theme each May to make sure people have plenty of time to get planning.

Anti-Bullying Week is coordinated by the Anti-Bullying Alliance (ABA) in England and Wales and the Northern Ireland Anti-Bullying Forum (ABA's sister organisation) in Northern Ireland.

World Cup Celebration week:

As you may know, the men's football world cup starts on Sunday 20th November, in Qatar. To celebrate this, we will be holding our own celebration week from the 21st November. Each class will draw out a country that they will research and support through the world cup; they will also participate in football coaching sessions and house group competitions.

Entry to the evening is free to families who make a food donation; alternatively a suggestion of a £5 donation for the whole family would be much appreciated.








Last Wednesday, our year 4, 5 and 6 cross country teams competed in the Islington Cross Country Championship and did remarkably well. Our year 4 team raced over 1200m and came 1st overall, with individual gold and silver medals for Ife and Oliver.

Attendance and Punctuality:

Over the next few weeks, you will receive via your child a copy of their attendance and punctuality record from September to 11th November.

It is expected that children's attendance is a minimal of

96%. Registration is taken twice a day so for example if your child is away for one day, this is recorded as two sessions missed.

Please make every effort to ensure your child is in school, unless they are obviously unwell. A very high number of children are absent on Mondays and Fridays; there is also a high proportion of children absent for nonhealth related reasons.
