Extended Schools:

Thank you so much for bearing with us over the last two weeks regarding our early closing.

I have made a decision to continue with the early closure of extended schools (5pm) until half term.

We are now in the second wave of covid-related staff absences since Christmas, with some of those who were at work last week now becoming infected with Omicron.

Our main priority remains the same, to keep classes open during the school day and prioritising the placement of available staff to ensure this. We are in the process of crediting the accounts of those parents affected by this and will let you know when this process is complete.

You may have noticed the school gates are closing promptly at 8.30am. We still have children arriving after this time which is disruptive to the class who have already started their first lesson.

COVID-19 UPDATE

Covid update:

Please familiarise yourself with the letter sent on Monday summarising what you are required to do if your child develops symptoms.

UPDATE AS OF 13/1

The isolation period for those who have tested positive for Covid has been cut to "5 full days" in England From Monday, people will be able leave isolation from the start of day six after two negative tests

- In addition, we will continue as we have been doing with regular handwashing/ sanitising and open doors / windows for good ventilation this term.
- Please provide your child with an additional layer (sweatshirt / jumper) that they can leave at school and wear in the classroom if required.

All classrooms have a CO2 monitor which measures how much air in the room has been breathed out and alerts the staff to ventilation requirements so additional windows and doors will be opened when necessary during the school day.

Reading Books - A little reminder:

As you know last year we asked the Parents Association to fundraise for new reading books.

We have invested £25,000 in books for both the classroom but primarily for home reading which the children are now taking home. We are following Ruth Miskin's highly successful phonics, reading and spelling program throughout the infants and juniors. The money donated has enabled us to purchase reading books for infants to read at home, that fully correspond to the phonics being taught in class on a daily basis.

We would really appreciate if you could spend fifteen minutes every evening reading with your child and then make a note of this in their reading record.

Book bags need to be returned daily to enable children to change their books and continue in their reading journey.

We will be providing an update on phonics, with some tips of how to engage children with reading at home, on Friday 28th January at 9am. This session will be particularly useful for parents of pupils in Reception and Year One. This will be via zoom.





Music teachers:

With generous funding from the PA, we are pleased to welcome Ms Gallagher and Mr Owen to our school, who will be teaching music throughout the school. The children are enjoying their music lessons and are engaging well.
