
PARENT EVENING TELEPHONE CONSULTATIONS



Breakfast and After school club:

It is more than likely that children will need to remain in their year group bubbles until June 21st. With that restriction in place, it is not going to be possible to reopen breakfast and after school club for the summer term. We will however, be sending out a questionnaire to parents in the summer term to ascertain need, in the great hope that we can reopen these services in September.

However, we really appreciate that children have had limited opportunities to participate in sports clubs during the pandemic and have missed out greatly on this aspect of their physical and social development.

For the summer term, we have organised for professional qualified coaches to lead on a variety of sports after school, alongside a couple of our teaching assistants offering childcare until 4.45pm. These will be offered for one evening to children in Years 1-6 and two evenings for Reception. Due to the high adult staff ratio required for nursery, we have been unable to accommodate nursery children on this occasion. I will be sending a separate email about this next week so look out for it in your inbox.



Ingress system:

Thank you to all caregivers for your support at drop-off time in the morning. A reminder that the **8.30** slot is for **Y5/6 pupils and their siblings**. If your child does not have a sibling in Y5/6, then they are **NOT** in the 8.30 timeslot. We are trying to balance a minimal number of children egressing plus convenience for families. Please turn up only for your allocated timeslot and on time.

Gates close 5mins after your allocated time. If you are late, do not worry or panic, we will accommodate you as soon as it is safe to do so.

This can consist of the school's PE kit or other jogging bottoms/ sweatshirts and trainers that you have to hand at home. School uniform will be reinstated after the Easter holidays. Hopefully this will also aid families who have said that they are finding sourcing school uniform at this time difficult.

COVID-19 UPDATE

National lockdown:

Lockdown rules for England from 8 March



Stay home - only leave for work, essential shopping, exercise or medical appointments

Exercise allowed outdoors once a day, in your local area. You can exercise with your household, support bubble, or one other person

All schools open, with outdoor after-school sports and activities allowed.

Two people can meet outdoors to socialise eg to sit down for a coffee, drink or picnic

Care home residents are allowed one regular visitor, with whom they can hold hands

No household mixing indoors or outdoors unless in your support or childcare bubble

Non-essential shops, leisure and entertainment venues closed

Pubs and restaurants closed, but takeaway food permitted
