Lockdown easing: What's changing in England from 17 May?



People can meet in groups of up to 30 outdoors



Six people or two households can meet indoors with overnight stays allowed

As part of the Step 3 roadmap, it has been determined that it is no longer necessary to recommend the additional precautionary face covering measures recommended by the government.

From Mon 17 May, in line with Step 3 of the roadmap, face coverings will no longer be recommended for personnel in classrooms or communal areas, in all schools.

Therefore we won't require parents/carers to wear a face covering on the school play-ground.
