As things are settling, we are planning to get a newsletter out to you every two weeks on a Friday so here goes this week's first edition of summer 2021.



Hairdressers, nail salons and other personal care businesses can reopen




Indoor gyms and sports facilities reopen for individual exercise or for exercise with your household or bubble

Possible change to the school's start and finish times and extended schools provision—September 2021:

As with all areas of school life, the pandemic has really made us rethink how best to run our school day and extended schools services from September. With teaching and learning being at the heart of the school, we are looking at changing the school start and finish times, as well as trying to be creative in how we can support you with childcare.

We have a few ideas which are going to be communicated to you in a separate letter which will be sent out, via e-mail, next Tuesday alongside a questionnaire. We really need to ascertain your views so please take some time to read the document and complete the questionnaire.
