Have a lovely weekend and a good half term break, when it arrives. I know that all the staff are now very much looking forward to that.


If I don't see you at the gate, I will see you at the coffee morning.

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## Book Week 4th – 7th March

We are delighted to announce that the school will be holding a book week commencing on Monday 4th March to celebrate the joy and importance of reading. The children will be participating in a number of reading activities during the week both in their class and as a year group. At 2.30 pm each day, the children will be able to choose to



listen to a story read by another adult in a different classroom.


In order for us to do this, we will need your help. We need donations of lots of books. We are looking for books of all genres from Reception level through to older readers (Years 6+). No baby books please.

#### Extended School Club Questionnaire

Thank you for taking the time to feedback your thoughts on our after-school provision. Our Governing Body Finance Committee are going to look at this in more detail at their meeting on 3rd February. In lieu of that communication, I thought a



quick summary of your feedback would be helpful. As predicted, parents are requesting more places to be made available for clubs on Tuesday to Thursday, in particular for gymnastics and football. This is mainly for the younger members of our school. I have met with our Extended Schools Manager, Mrs Cumpstey to look at this in particular and there are enough places for both girls and boys football as these clubs are not full. We have contacted the gymnastics company that we use and they are going to try and provide us with a second coach for the Autumn Term.

You will receive a newsletter from the extended schools service the week beginning the 5th February about their summer term offer. Advance notice - bookings for childcare for the summer term will go live on **25th February and clubs on 28th February.** 

I have also met with representatives of the Parents' Association to see what we can do with regard to reigniting our plans to complete our extended schools building. Long serving parents will know that this was partially constructed in Summer 2020, with the hope that we could complete this in the coming years. This includes the installation of a kitchen and art room. Having a purpose-built extended schools building would enable us to increase our daily numbers in our extended schools service, branch out into holiday care for St Joan of Arc pupils, as well as all children being able to use these facilities during the school day. In essence all children would benefit from this. We are not entitled to any grants or support for this, so fundraising for this would need to be part of our fund-raising initiative. I know this is not a good time to draw your attention to this but the parents' association already have a live fundraising initiative for this purpose. If you are able to donate, please do so. It is very much appreciated. Details are included in the newsletter.
