As a school it is really important that we keep accurate records of the children's attendance


If your child is unwell, or will be absent from school for any reason, please telephone the school office and press 1 on the automated message service to report the absence. Alternatively you can e-mail on:

This October, our school will be celebrating Black History Month. This is a special time dedicated to celebrating the achievements. contributions and rich cultures of Black people throughout history and in our world today. It also provides us with an opportunity to learn about the struggles that Black people have encountered and learn about some inspirational figures who have demonstrated great courage, kindness and perseverance when faced with adversity.

In Nursery and Reception: The children will explore the picture books: Coming to England by Floella Benjamin and the My First Heroes; Black History book, which introduces the children to Maya Angelou, Stormzy, Nelson Mandela and Rosa Parks. Linked to Floella Benjamin's Coming to England they will also explore the episode of Jo Jo and Gran Gran ' We're Going on a Voyage'. These resources open up conversations about immigration, the Windrush generation and family history.





Teach Team 1 Will explore the life of astronaut Mae Jemison (the first black woman to go to space). Linked to the book Look Up by Nathan Bryon, the children will explore her life and how she worked hard to become a pioneering figure who inspired others to follow their dreams.

Year 2 Will learn about the life of Walter Tull. Walter Tull was both a talented footballer and a brave soldier during the First World War. His story teaches powerful lessons about how he overcame challenges and worked hard to achieve great things in his life, both on the football pitch and in the army. He also demonstrated incredible bravery by fighting for his country and being one of the first Black men to become an officer in the British Army, even when rules said he couldn't.





Year 3 Children will learn about the life of Benjamin Zephaniah. A son of parents of the Windrush generation, Benjamin overcame prejudice and a challenging upbringing to become one of the most loved British poets. The children will explore his life story, his poetry and learn how he was able to in an accessible and child-friendly way.

Year 4: Linked to their study of America in geography, the children will learn about the story of Matthew Henson; a man of significant achievement largely ignored in his lifetime due to the colour of his skin. Their learning will centre around the book Race to the Frozen North by Catherine Johnson.





FLOELLA BENJAMIN Year 5: Across the month, the children in Year 5 will read the Coming to novel form of Floella Benjamin's Coming to England. Her childhood memoir **England** recalls her family's journey from Trinidad in the 1960s and the challenges and triumphs she and her family encountered. The story is one of courage overcoming adversity.

Year 6: Across October, the children will read and explore the story Journey to Jo'burg by Beverly Naidoo. The story is one of bravery during the dangerous landscape of apartheid South Africa. Alongside the fictional story, the children will learn about the history of apartheid and the inspiration for the book.

This is a safety measure due to the volume of people on the




grounds. At the end of the day, they are to walk their scooter or bicycle and only mount them once they've exited the gates. Thank you for your cooperation.
