Secondary School Applications:

A reminder regarding applications for admission into Secondary School – September 2026

The closing date for applications into Year 7 is 31st October 2025. You must also complete an application form from the borough in which you reside.

Reception Applications:

If you have a child born between 1 September 2021 and 31 August 2022, your

child will be eligible to apply for a Reception place in September. Please remember that transfer from Nursery to Reception is not automatic - a new application needs to be made via the council online platform, and a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) needs to be submitted to the school. Supplementary Information Forms are available on the school website or at the school office. Please see the Reception Admissions Policy on the school website for details of documents to be submitted with the SIF. The deadline for applications is 15th January 2026.

Nursery Applications:

We also have spaces in our nursery, so if your child is three years of age before 31st December (or you know of anyone with a three-year-old not in nursery), please visit our website for an application form.

Throughout the year, they will be involved in more projects to help support he mental wellbeing of our school community.




PA AGM -Thursday 7th November @ 8pm

Our wonderful PA have their PA AGM on Thursday 6th November at 8pm via zoom. This is an opportunity for us to thank those parents who worked so tirelessly last year to raise funds for our school and to welcome new members and find out our fundraising goals for this year. As we have already said, every parent is automatically part of the PA so if you can't normally attend the meetings held on a Friday morning, this meeting will hopefully enable you to feel part of the wider school community. Using last year's funds, we were able to purchase the following:

- 120 new Chrome Books to support with the school's drive on digital learning
- Charging cabinets for chrome books
- All classes are taught by a specialist music teacher weekly
- Reading books have been updated for both class libraries and phonics benefitting all year groups
- New playground benches, sun umbrellas, and cushions for our tree house
- Updated our lunchtime equipment
- A donation towards the school's art therapist
- The Year 6 activity week was subsidised by donations from the PA. Each pupil also received a leavers' sweatshirt and attended their special disco at the end of the year


