Dear Parents & Carers,

The news this week has been very upsetting. We try to create a safe haven at school for the children to protect them from the most traumatic news, while sensitively praying for any countries in conflict. Praying for peace is all we can do.

Last week, we spoke in assembly about Black History Month, but that as St Joan of Arc this is not relegated to one month a year, we celebrate all year round. This year's theme of 'Saluting Sisters' highlights the crucial role that black women have played in shaping history, inspiring change and building communities. Yesterday the focus of our assembly was on Floella Benjamin, the Trinidadian-British actress, singer, presenter, author and politician. We discussed how Floella and her family moved to England when she was a young girl and how she was the first presenter on TV to wear beads in her hair. I read Floella's children's book 'Coming to England', where the children heard that it took a while for Floella to feel welcomed to the country. We also talked about how we welcome all new children to St Joan of Arc and what we do to ensure they quickly become part of our school community. Secondary School Applications:

A reminder regarding applications for admission into Secondary School – September 2024

The closing date for applications into Year 7 is 31st October. You must also complete an application form from the borough in which you reside.

Reception Applications:

If you have a child born between 1 September 2019 and 31 August 2020, your child will be eligible to apply for a Reception place in September. Please remember that transfer from Nursery to Reception is not automatic - a new application needs to be made via the council online platform, and a Supplementary Information Form (SIF) needs to be submitted to the school. Supplementary Information Forms are available on the school website or at the school office. Please see the Reception Admissions Policy on the school website for details of documents to be submitted with the SIF. The deadline for applications is 15th January 2024.

Nursery Applications:

We also have spaces in our nursery, so if your child is three years of age before 31st December (or you know of anyone with a three-year-old not in nursery), please visit our website for an application form.




National and local schemes available to help with childcare costs:




Astronomy Roadshow
