The children became the jury and decided whether or not to send characters to jail for their crimes against planet earth. The facilitators then went into each classroom to deliver a session with the classes. They were impressed by the children's knowledge of sustainability and loved that as a school we are composting and recycling. The Garden Classroom will be working with the school's Eco-Team all year long to support us on our journey to be a more sustainable place, alongside ten other Islington schools.
