



## ST JOAN OF ARC CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOL PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY

*It is important to note that 10 weeks of remote learning took place from January to March due to a national closure of schools.*

### What is the Pupil Premium?

The pupil premium is a grant that schools receive to support pupils who have ever been eligible for free school meals, or who have been in the care of their local authority. Research shows that these pupils are more likely to underachieve, so the premium is provided in order to help us maximize their learning potential. 16% of our pupils are eligible for the pupil premium. In 2020-21 we were allocated £119,360 and for 2021-22 we have been allocated £122,050

### What are the barriers to educational achievement?

External barriers	Internal barriers

### **How will we allocate Pupil Premium funding?**

Our priority is funding additional adult support for eligible pupils. This ensures pupils receive targeted interventions which address their barriers to educational achievement. The school was proud to receive a Pupil Premium Achievement Award in 2016 in recognition of our success in improving outcomes for eligible pupils.

### **Groups Targeted (2021-22)**

Pupils eligible for the pupil premium, in particular those:

- who require additional Writing and Maths support in Years 3-6
- who require additional support in Writing and Maths in Key Stage 1
- who require additional language and communication support in the Early Years and Key Stage 1
- who have medical or pastoral needs, or other barriers to learning
