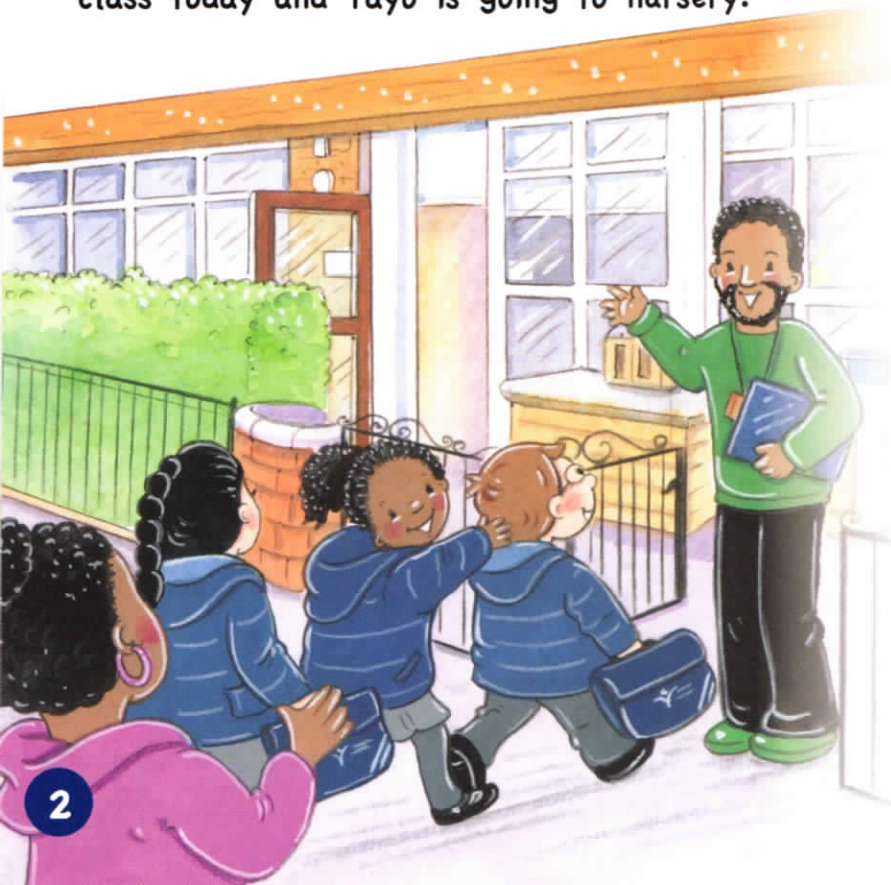

What will I do in nursery or school?

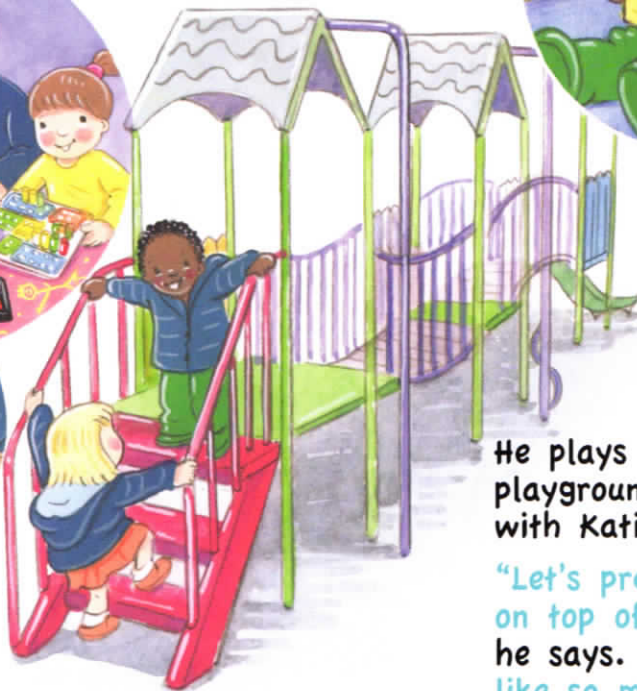
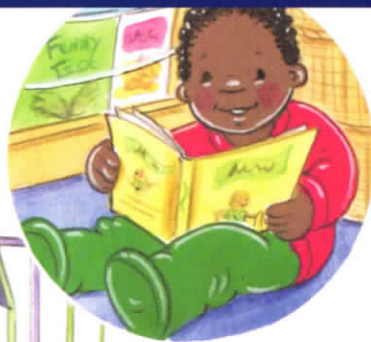
Sometimes you will do activities with your teacher and sometimes you will do activities with your friends or by yourself. You will learn and make friends as you play. There are lots of great things for you to do.

"I am going to make a lovely picture with pieces I have cut out," he says.

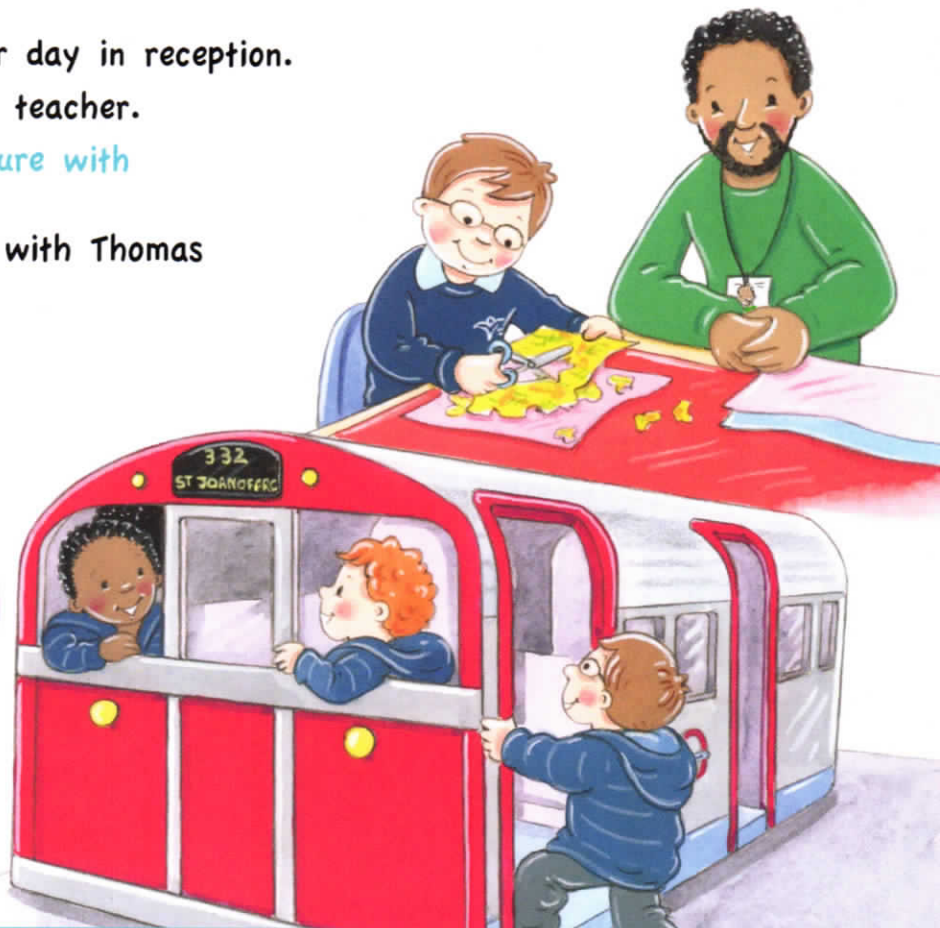
Lucas is playing on the play train with Thomas and Emmanuel.

When you go into the hall, you will see lots of delicious food so there should be something you like every day. There is always lots of delicious food so there will be something you like every day. A vegetarian option is always available.

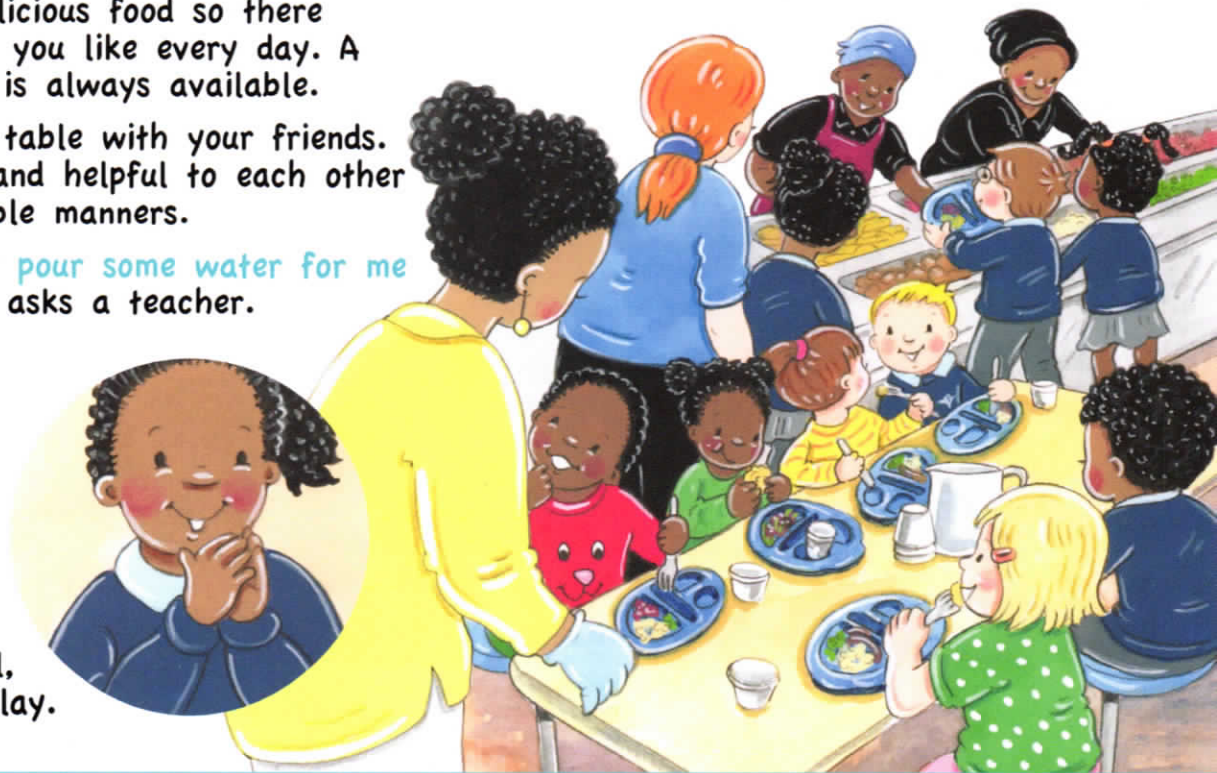
You will sit at a table with your friends. Everyone is kind and helpful to each other and uses good table manners.

What if I need the toilet?

If you are in nursery, you can go to the toilet whenever you need to. There will be an adult there to help you. They will help you to wash your hands when you have finished.



Tayo is going to use the toilet by himself today. Everything is just the right size for him and so easy to use.

If you are in reception, let your teacher know when you need to go to the toilet and you will go by yourself.

Selam has used the toilet, and now she is washing her hands with warm water and soap. She will make sure she dries them before she goes back to her class.

"I am so pleased that I practised going to the toilet by myself before I started school," says Selam.

Don't worry if you have a toilet accident. Just tell your teacher and they will help.

What happens at the end of your nursery or school day?

At the end of the day, you will sit on the carpet and listen to a story.

Then you will all say the evening prayer:

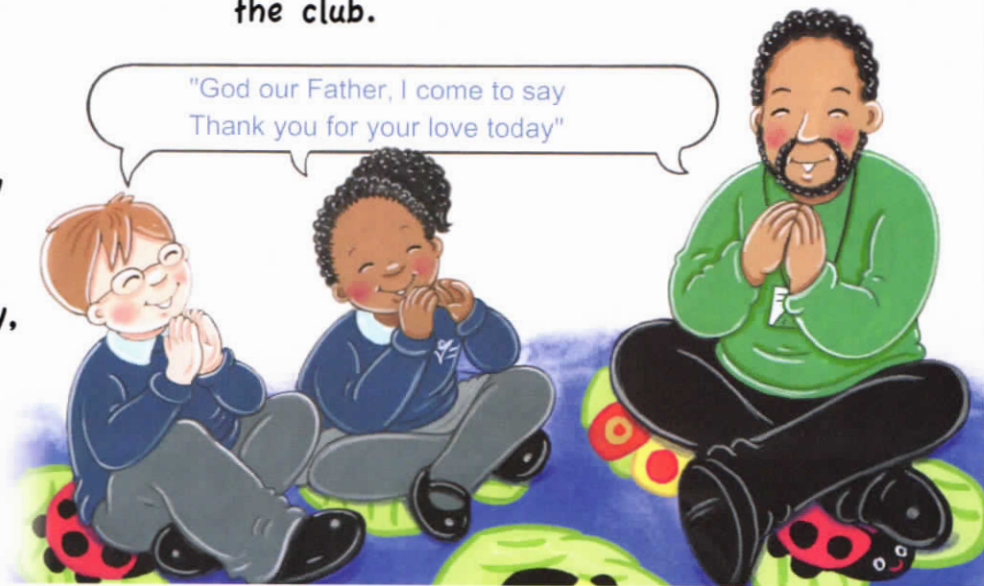
"God our Father, I come to say

You will collect your belongings and put your coat on. Each day, you will take home a reading book in your book bag. You will look at your book with your grown-up at home.

If you are going home straight after school, your grown-up will wait for you outside your classroom. Your teacher will stand at the door and when they see your grown-up, they will call your name and you can go out to meet them.

If you are going to the after-school club, a teacher will collect you and take you to the club.



Tayo is happy to see his mum.

Later that evening, he looks at the book he brought home from school.

"Look, Mum. There is a little rabbit in the book that looks just like my bunny," he says. He loves reading with his grown-ups.
