

The school has recently purchased a subscription to the Oxford Owl online reading platform. This allows children to access a vast range of levelled e-books to further enhance their reading opportunities at school and at home. This week the children have been given their class log-ins to explore the website. A link to the website has been posted on Google Classroom this week but it can also be accessed directly through any internet browser.

To access the website via the browser, type in the website: www.oxfordowl.co.uk

This will take you to the home page. In the top right hand corner, children should then click on the pink section that says- My class log in.

Children should then enter their class username and password- these will be in your child's reading record and on Google Classroom. This is not an individual log in but a shared one for the whole class. Without their class log-in, children will only be able to access the free resources which are much more limited in range.

Log in

Once your child has successfully logged in they will come to the home page where they can access all of the e-books that the school has access to. There are also some videos for parents, designed to help you assist your child's reading development.



On the home page, once logged in, the children will be able to access 4 book collections. All of the books within each section are ordered sequentially, from books for starter readers through to books for older readers.

The Oxford Owl e-book library is the widest ranging collection and children can peruse all of these books. To be most effective, children should read books selected from their own book colour band. To find books in your child's colour band, use the levels filter and then select the relevant colour from the book band drop down option.

The Read Write Inc e-book Library is specifically tailored for children learning phonics. Some of the books simply provide words for children to practise blending (with useful adult guidance included), while others provide this within a story setting.

The project X Code resources are for children in years 2-4 who need some consolidation of the reading skills they developed during key stage 1 (particularly phonics and sentence construction). All of the books in this section have an audio option -this allows children to listen to the book being read aloud by pressing the green audio play buttons (in the bottom left hand corner of each selected e-book). These books will be used for specific interventions within school.

The Word Sparks section is great for starter readers and provides a range of e-books that children read while listening to the words being read aloud at the same time.

We think that the investment in the resources will really help to boost children's reading attainment. While we pride ourselves on giving the children excellent reading instruction throughout their time at school, the clearest way to reading success is through consistent regular home reading. We hope that these resources will complement the physical reading books the children take home with them and provide new and exciting ways to enhance reading in the home.
